A strange and different year of our lives is crowded into these pages. That is why one of the most cherished mementos of our youth must be - VAPOR TRAILS.

1529 - Henry VIII establishes the Royal Deer Park of Hampton Court Palace in the area now known as Bushy Park Air Force Base.

After having three touchdowns called back, the Sabres finally got rolling with two Fletcher to Koch scores of 15 and 23 yards. The other two touchdowns were scored by the sensational junior quarterback. For the first time the Chateauroux defense really had to battle as they fought Ronnie Tapp and Company on the home field. After a goal line stand, the Sabres won their fourth straight victory.
The championship game against Poitiers proved to be the most exciting of the season. Again facing the rough Panther defense and offense, the Sabres had to fight for their lives and the final 40-30 victory against this determined team. In this game Fletcher threw passes of 12,25 , and 28 yards to Dennis Grimm who went over for the scores. The other scoring pass was a 20 yard heave to Clint Oyler. Besides hitting with these four tosses Ron Fletcher carried the ball for two other touchdowns. Also playing brilliantly for the Sabres was a fine fullback, Bill Slinkard, who churned over for two PATs and speedy Joe Richards who took off on several long jaunts.
The Chateauroux Sabres were the leading offensive team in Europe with 154 points. Ron Fletcher, Chateauroux quarterback, led European scoring with a high total of 57 points.
Many thanks go to the two wonderful coaches Elliott and Henderson who molded our team into the one which won the France Championship in an undefeated season.

When officials of Wiesbaden High were greeted this September with news of an additional enrollment of more than two hundred students, it appeared as if half-day sessions for everyone would be the only solution to the shortage of classrooms. Instead, however, the problem was solved without a single student having to lose a minute of his valuable education, through the addition of two more buildings to the already large Wiesbaden High School system.

The AYA, which lies adjacent to the main building, has long played an important part in high school social events. This year, however, it appeared as one enormous classroom to the casual passer-by as he watched more than one hundred students enter and leave the building between each period.

The dormitory, situated across the street from the school, has been serving Wiesbaden High for many years. Each semester many American students arrive at Wiesbaden's dorm, bringing tales of far-off lands that few of us have had the opportunity to see. Now, for the first time, a second dormitory has been created at Wiesbaden Air Base in order that more of these resident
students may be accommodated. The Hainerberg dorm, in addition, serves many other students by providing a hot lunch daily at a nominal cost.
The hub of the Arnold school system is the main building. This two-story structure contains more than twenty-five classrooms and a large, wellstaffed office. These classrooms include both laboratories and lecture rooms for biology, chemistry, and physics. Attached to the main building is an auditorium with a capacity of four hundred, and a gymnasium which has witnessed many exciting moments in the athletic lives of Wiesbaden's spirited students.

Here then is part of the story of our school, but it is not a complete one. The most important part of our school is its people. In Wiesbaden our students and teachers come to us from all corners of the U.S. A., and they represent a good crosssection of America; besides this, many of them have lived and worked in the most interesting parts of the world. It is for this reason, then, that we believe our school to be one of the finest any where.
