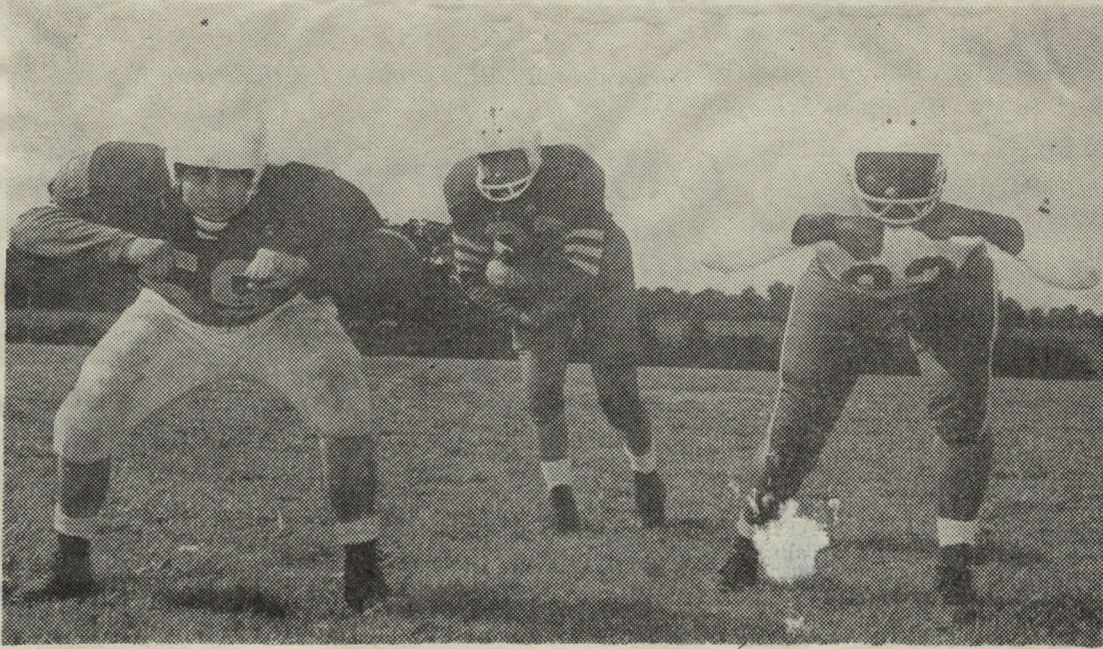




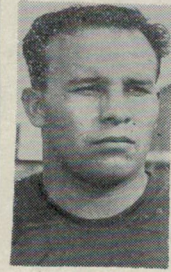




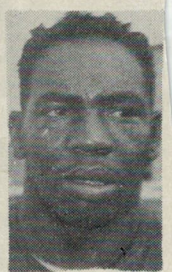
# Sabre Charges Win USAFE All-Star Roles

## Sabre Eleven Downed by Chicksands 20-8; 'Kelly Romps for 107 Yard TD

The 1960 Sabre football team played its first game of the season last Saturday in an exhibition tilt at Chicksands RAF Station, England. They were handed a 20-8 setback via a strong aerial attack.

The Sabre team fought the Chicksands eleven to a 0-0 deadlock for the first half of the game before a quick pass over center early in the third quarter and the conversion put the Sabres behind 7-0.

### 107-Yard TD Run

Chicksands kicked to Chateauroux and halfback Jim Kelly, taking the ball deep in his own end zone, twisted and weaved his way through the entire Chicksands team and scampered the rest of the 107 yards for the score. This was

the longest run ever recorded by a Sabre. Then, tailback Ron Jenkins went off tackle to put the Sabres in front 8-7.

Late in the fourth quarter Chicksands again took to the air for two more tallies to end the scoring at 20-8.

### Dominate Groundwork

Statistics showed the Sabres dominated the ground attack throughout the game, and, as line coach Bill Smith put it, «This line of ours is going to cause the other FSD teams a lot of headaches this year. Our boys dug in and held Chicksands for four downs inside the one yard line, and they're supposed to have one of the powerhouses in the United Kingdom this year».

Head coach Chuck Batchelor asked to comment on the game, said, «Naturally no one likes to take a licking, but even so, the morale on our team is real high. We came out of the game in good shape, with only a few minor injuries. I still think we've got a fighting squad here, and, unless I miss my guess, we're going to topple over some of the big teams before the season is over».

The regular football season for the Sabres will begin here on Sept. 10, when they will host the strong Army team from Verdun.

Three flashy Sabre backfield men and one hard-hitting lineman were chosen to fill roles of all-stars, it was announced by the athletic division this week.

Halfback Jim Kelly, quarterback John Cashwell, and guard Dave Madril were elected to the Continental Conference All-Star team, while another halfback, Nat Long — along with Madril — will tryout for berths on the USAFE All-Stars.

Madril was the only one of coach Chuck Batchelor's charges named to the first string of the conference All-Stars.

The USAFE team, after the ranks of dozens of Europe's best Air Force gridmen have been thinned, will be pitted against the Army's USAREUR All-Stars in the Freedom Bowl. The bowl game will be played on Dec. 4 at Ludwigshafen, Germany.

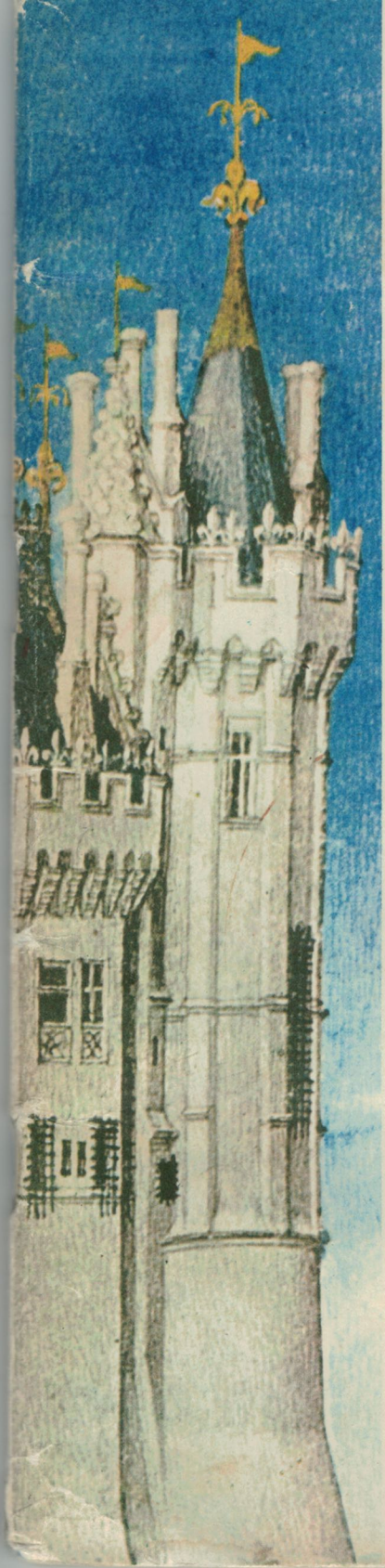
